Year 5 – Year 12 Student Tokens

Students will need to purchase tokens to buy food or take part in activities on Unfair Day. Each token is valued at \$5 and can be used in \$1 increments for both food and activities.

Tokens can be purchased in \$5 vouchers and are non-refundable. All money collected from token purchases will be distributed across our Catholic charities. Any leftover tokens can either be held and used during Unfair Day in 2026 (at the child's responsibility) or disposed, and the money remaining will contribute as a donation to our Catholic charities.

Activities will range in cost from \$1 to \$3, with food priced between \$5 and \$8. A full price list will be published on SEQTA notices closer to the date. Year 5/6 students may wish to bring a packed lunch as a backup.

- **Pre-Purchased Tokens**

Families can pre-purchase tokens for Unfair Day. Pre-orders must be completed before 4:00 pm on Wednesday 17 September 2025 through the TryBooking link: <https://www.trybooking.com/DEVFA>. Pre-purchased tokens will be distributed by teachers during PC on Unfair Day.
