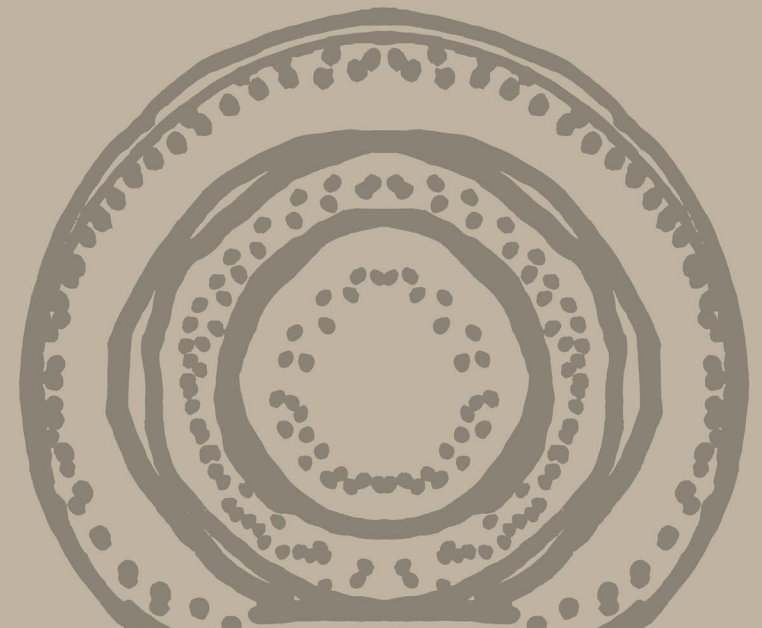
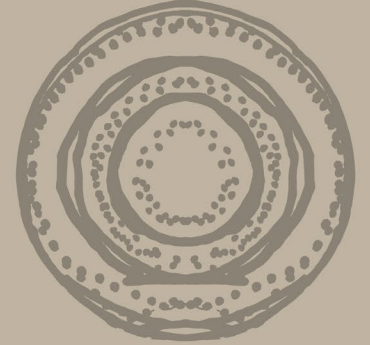

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House Structure

- Every student from Reception to Year 12 is placed in one of six Houses.
- Each has a Head of House, a Year 12 Prefect – House Captain and Vice Captain.
- Student leaders play a significant role in the wellbeing of their peers and embody being a “Man for Others”.
- Houses congregate every week to build comradery and discuss topics of importance to teenage boys.
- Our Pastoral Care (PC) system brings boys together in a vertical system (7-12) daily.

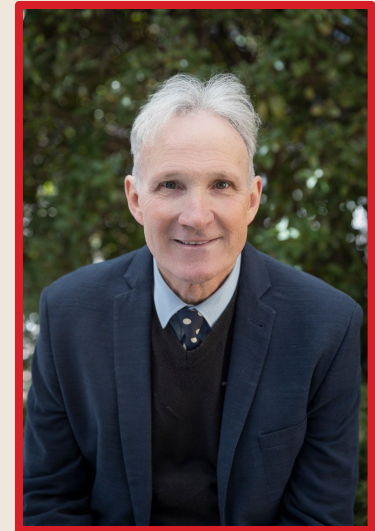

Pastoral Care

The Pastoral Care (PC) is the first point of contact for students and parents/caregivers when issues and/or concerns arise.

This may include:

- Unexplained/consistent absences from school
- Lateness to school/lessons
- Uniform & grooming
- Behaviour issues
- Learning issues
- Wellbeing check-ins
- Goal setting and reviewing
- General mentoring and developing a strong relationship



Pastoral Care Programs

Each year level will take part in various programs within their Wednesday lesson, based in horizontal groups within each House.

- Years 7, 8, 10 & 11 – Wellbeing delivered largely through the online platform, Wellio
- Year 9 – The Rite Journey
- Year 12 – Mentoring with Head of House

eiPulse

- Weekly check-ins to monitor the wellbeing of individuals, year levels and House groups
- Each student is asked to complete a 2-minute check-in, every Wednesday
- PC Teachers and Heads of House follow up with students who check-in with 'I'm feeling negative' or 'I need some help'



Restorative Justice

Rostrevor uses 'restorative practices' when dealing with conflicts between students or in some cases between teacher and student. There are five main principles to Restorative Practice:

1. **Relationship** – Has been harmed in some way. The aim is to repair the harm by giving the offender an opportunity to take responsibility and make amends.
2. **Respect** – Each party listening to what the other has to say.
3. **Responsibility** – Each party taking some form of responsibility for the breakdown in the relationship.
4. **Repair** – Giving the offender an opportunity to repair the relationship, usually by an apology, but also on occasions by 'giving back' to the community.
5. **Reintegration** – Welcoming back into the learning environment or friendship/class setting.



Mobile Phone Policy

Students are not to use their mobile phones at any time during the school day. Students' phones are to be off and away during the school day, stored in their locker. Any student using their phone during school hours will be required to hand their phone to Student Services to be collected at the end of the day. Further offences incur further consequences.

If there is an urgent need to contact a parent/caregiver, this can be done through Student Services.

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Grooming Standards

- Hats to be worn outside in Terms 1 & 3
- Summer uniform in Terms 1 & 4, winter uniform in Terms 2 & 3
- No extreme haircuts/colours or eyebrow slits
- Clean shaven
- Shirts to be tucked in
- Rostrevor branded uniform items only, except for shoes
- No jewellery
- PE uniform only to be worn on days that student has PE. Year 11 & 12s to wear formal uniform every day and bring their PE uniform to get changed into





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Student Leadership

Student leadership opportunities are available across Years 7 to 12, and consist of:

- Prefects | 13 x Year 12s
- Arts Vice Captains | 1 per year level, Years 7 to 11
- Identity Vice Captains | 1 per year level, Years 7 to 11
- Sports Vice Captains | 1 per year level, Years 7 to 11
- House Vice Captains x 6 | 1 per year level, Years 7 to 12
- Boarding Vice Captains





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Co-Curricular

Every student is to participate in at least one co-curricular activity per year. This could include a sport, debating or music.

Nominations for a co-curricular activity are seen as firm commitments to participate in all training and matches/performances for the season.





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Social Justice Group

The Social Justice Group is a group of around 40 students who meet once a week to identify initiatives that not only respond to community needs, but also nurture a culture of inclusion, stewardship and solidarity across the College.

They volunteer for activities such as the Vinnies Winter Sleepout, charity BBQs, aged care facility visits, emu parades or the Special Olympics.



Counselling

Rostrevor employs a dedicated counsellor who can assist students with:

- Peer relationships
- Family difficulties
- Grief and loss
- Stress/study management
- Mental health
- Resilience and emotional regulation

Students can book to see the counsellor at any time or be referred by a teacher or parent/caregiver.
